

# Plan for the Delivery of QQI Modules in St. Ita's Special School (Sept 2022)

This document sets out the plan adopted by St. Ita's Special School for the Delivery of QQI modules for September 2022

St. Ita's Special School follows closely the guidelines and standards set out by QQI in the delivery of all its modules. The School delivers all modules in person and on site.

## Our Programme of Study

- We have divided our cohort of students into 4 form classes and each form teacher will deliver our Learning for Life programme through 5 themes to reflect and ensure the delivery of a wide curriculum suitable to promote independent life skills.
- All teachers will teach the five themes at the same time throughout the Academic year. Differentiating between levels 1 - 3
- Level 1 Major Award: P1GLO The teachers will focus on the delivery of 4 Modules, Personal Safety M1H15, Personal Decision Making M1L12, Personal Care M1H14, and Listening and Speaking M1C03 a total of 17 Learning Outcomes. This is a 1 year programme.
- Level 2 Major Award P2GLO: The teachers will focus on the delivery of 5 Modules for students to obtain a full cert at this level. They are: Non-Verbal Communication M2C04, Quantity & Number M2N05, Visual Art M2A18, Craft M2A19, Drama M2A22, Food choice and health M2H16, a total of 37 Learning Outcomes. This is a 1 year programme
- Level 3 Major Award 3M0874: The teachers will focus on the delivery of 8 Modules, Communication - 3N0880, Mathematics 3N0929, Word Processing 3N0588, Personal Effectiveness 3N0565, Drama 3N0922, Drawing 3N0581, Nutrition and Healthy Options 3N0887 and Woodwork 3N0589. This is a two year programme.

Protection of Enrolled Learners (PEL) arrangements - Any student who is working on our Level 3 Award can continue studying for their qualification through any of the HSE funded day services that they may move on to. St Ita's follow the guidelines set out by QQI for the protection of learners.

## **Assessment**

All assessments are carried out in school and may take a number of approaches:

1. Group work – Group work and collaboration across modules
2. Presentations – These can be assisted by powerpoints
3. Written assessments - completed under exam conditions
4. Practical tasks - We encourage our students to become as independent as possible within the community.
